Feeding Delaware's Children

Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT)

Delaware's P-EBT Program provides food assistance to families with children who lost access to free or reduced-price school meals because of school closures caused by the COVID-19 coronavirus outbreak.

The Delaware Division of Social Services and Delaware Department of Education are providing P-EBT benefits to eligible families to help households purchase food while schools are closed. Families can use their P-EBT benefits to buy eligible food items at stores and farmer's markets that accept SNAP EBT.

Who is eligible for P-EBT benefits?

To qualify for P-EBT benefits, children must:

- 1) Be enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade at a Delaware school that participates in the National School Lunch Program AND
- 2) Be eligible to receive free or reduced-price school meals when schools are open OR attend a school where all students receive free school meals

Families are eligible to receive P-EBT benefits for each child in their household who qualifies for the P-EBT Program based on these two conditions.

How are P-EBT benefits issued?

Families who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) food benefits as well as other eligible families will receive P-EBT benefits on an EBT card. P-EBT benefits will automatically be loaded onto a family's existing SNAP EBT card or onto one or more new P-EBT card(s). The P-EBT benefits for all of the eligible children in a household will be loaded to the family's SNAP EBT or P-EBT card. Families that are getting a new P-EBT card will receive their card in the mail in mid-May.

Families do not need to apply for P-EBT benefits. Eligible families are automatically enrolled in the P-EBT Program and will be notified by mail. Families will receive detailed information on the P-EBT Program and how to use P-EBT benefits to purchase food.

How do I apply for free or reduced-price school meals?

Please contact the Nutrition Department for your child's school district, charter school, or private school for information on how to apply for free or reduced-price school meals. The contact information for school's that participate in the National School Lunch Program can be found at doe.k12.de.us/Page/2789. General questions related to eligibility for free or reduced-price meals may be emailed to schoolnutrition@doe.k12.de.us. If your child attends a school where all students receive free school meals, you are automatically enrolled in the P-EBT Program and do not need to apply for free or reduced-price school meals.
